Dear Families,

Herne Bay Coastal Fieldwork - 24th March and 25th March, 2026

Our Geography Department is pleased to announce an upcoming fieldwork visit for our Year 10 students to Herne Bay in Kent on the 24th and 25th March. This visit will provide students with a valuable opportunity to gain hands-on experience in conducting coastal fieldwork, an essential part of their KS4 curriculum and GCSE assessment in Paper 2.

We will journey from LPGS to Reculver in Kent and then on to Herne Bay by coach and minibus. Students should be on-site by 8:00am, and we plan to return to school at approximately 4pm. The itinerary is as follows:

- Students register at 8:00am in the **Sports Hall**
- Board the coach at 8:20am to head to Reculver
- Arrive around 10:00am for fieldwork at Site 1
- Board again at approximately 12:30pm following lunch to travel to Herne Bay
- Fieldwork continues at Herne Bay until 2:30pm, when we head back to school
- Students will be dismissed from the LPGS site upon our return

It is expected the students will wear clothes they will be able to move in during the day. These must be sensible such as leggings or tracksuit. **Students are not allowed to wear vest tops or crop tops.** Student's will also be on uneven surfaces and will be required to walk, therefore will need to wear sensible footwear such as trainers, hiking boots or wellies.

As the students will be outside most of the day so we would recommend they bring sun cream and a warm waterproof coat. They will need to bring their own packed lunch and refreshments with them. There will not be many opportunities for the students to spend money, so we recommend they bring no more than £10.

If students bring valuables such as mobile phones or cameras they do so at their own risk.

This is an optional trip and we are asking for a voluntary contribution of £16.80 which includes transport to Herne bay and Reculver. If we do not receive enough voluntary contributions then the trip may have to be cancelled so your co-operation in responding promptly is appreciated. As always, if parents/carers feel they can make a contribution on behalf of another student as well as their own, this is very much appreciated. Please complete the consent form which will be sent out through our trip system, Evolve, and make the payment via MCAS before the 23rd February 2026.

To help students prepare, we suggest they review the content and lessons on coastal geography and consider using resources such as Seneca and BBC Bitesize for additional support.

Please note that any student may be removed from this trip should their behaviour be a cause for concern in school.
