Dear Families,

It has been another busy week here at LPGS, with a variety of enrichment activities taking place across the school.

On Wednesday, a number of Year 10 students had the opportunity to explore the world of Formula 1 during a STEM Day. Through hands-on activities and problem-solving challenges, student teams assigned roles, explored design and engineering, and presented and raced their cars before a group of industry specialists acting as judges. Our Robotics Club also joined students at Langley Park School for Boys to work collaboratively to share and test their builds.







Our Year 11 and Year 13 PE students have been hard at work during dedicated revision sessions today, in preparation for their upcoming GCSE and A-Level exams this summer. Alongside academic intervention sessions taking place after school, in a range of subjects, these sessions are intended to help students consolidate their knowledge, refine their exam technique and build confidence as they approach the critical months ahead. I actively encourage students preparing for exams to take up these opportunities regularly in support of their revision.

On Monday, our A-Level Psychology students embarked on an enlightening trip to the Freud Museum in London. This visit offered them a unique insight into the life and work of Sigmund Freud, as well as an opportunity to deepen their understanding of key topics in their curriculum. Our ski trip preparations are now well underway, with a number of students taking to a dry ski slope this week to hone their skills. This practice session not only built excitement for the trip later this academic year, but also provided a safe and supportive environment for students to develop their confidence and technique on the slopes.

Finally, Thursday saw us host our Sixth Form Open Evening, which was a wonderful opportunity to welcome current students and families, as well as those considering joining us from other schools. The Sixth Form community here at LPGS is ambitious, friendly and welcoming. Our students have a track record of achieving considerable success in A-Level and vocational qualifications, as a result of their commitment and the teaching provided by experienced and passionate teachers.

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Our current Year 12 and Year 13 students talked with pride about the subjects they are studying, their experience within LPGS6 and their support on the evening was invaluable. I am grateful to all the staff and students who gave up their time and hope that the information we provided will help our Year 11 students make informed decisions in the coming months.



As we approach the end of term, I look forward to seeing our staff and students perform at next week's Winter Concert and to seeing Christmas jumpers on show around school on Thursday in support of Save the Children.
