Hearing our Head Prefects and Senior Prefects talking so eloquently, passionately and positively about their experiences in LPGS Sixth Form left me feeling immensely proud of them and the LPGS community. As in previous years, we will be making minor changes to the timings of the school day on Thursday (an earlier finish) and Friday (a delayed start) and we will confirm details with you next week.

SEND and Wellbeing Hubs

September saw the opening of the new SEND Hub, which replaces the former Student Support area. This dedicated space is designed specifically for our students with additional needs and disabilities, offering a comprehensive range of support services. We will collaborate closely with the new Wellbeing Hub to ensure that our students receive the emotional and academic support they need promptly and effectively.

The SEND Hub is home to the Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) team, our Learning Support Assistants (LSAs), the English as an Additional Language team (EAL), our Specialist Literacy Teacher/Exams Access Arrangements assessor, and our Deputy Safeguarding Officer.



Within the Hub, we are providing a variety of interventions tailored for students with SEND, including speech and language therapy, British Sign Language and Catch-up programmes, along with our established GCSE English nurture classes and Learning support sessions.

We are excited about the potential of this new inclusive provision and look forward to seeing it become a vital resource that helps our students reach their full potential.

In addition, we have created a dedicated space called the Wellbeing Hub. This hub is home to our Safeguarding Team and Pastoral Managers, who bring expert knowledge and experience to support young people with many aspects of life, including mental health and overall wellbeing. Our structured framework and Wellbeing Tiers of Support guide students through various levels of care, starting with form tutors and moving to specialised support plans, and, when needed, liaising with external professionals.

We recognise and understand the crucial role wellbeing plays for both students and staff and are excited about our plans to further develop the space. Aligned with our vision and values statement, we aim to create a calming environment that fosters belonging and enables everyone to thrive.




Thank you to everyone who attended the Year 11 and 12 events earlier this week, the presentations are now available on our <u>website</u>.
