It has been an inspiring and eventful week filled with enriching experiences for our students across a variety of subjects and activities.

On Monday, students in Years 7-10 and Year 12 took part in an Online Safety Day on the challenges, opportunities and risks of the digital world. Sessions, delivered by an expert from ECP Safeguarding, covered topics such as online reputation, harmful content, grooming, sextortion, and the unseen pressures of social media. These sessions were a crucial reminder of the importance of staying safe and making responsible choices online - we encourage parents/carers to continue these conversations at home.

Meanwhile, our Science Department has been a hive of activity throughout our celebration of British Science Week. Students enjoyed hands-on lunchtime activities, including bath bomb chemistry, a mini-beast safari and a conservation session in our pond and wildlife area. A highlight of the week was our Primary Science Festival, where we welcomed pupils from our trust primary schools to take part in exciting experiments. We also hosted our own Langley TED Talks by Year 12 students in the Lecture Theatre. I would like to thank our teachers and technicians for delivering such a fun-packed programme of activities, for sharing their knowledge and enthusiasm for science, and for inspiring a future generation of scientists. Further afield, students in Years 10 and 12 had the fantastic opportunity to visit Mansfield College, Oxford, and Gonville & Caius College, Cambridge. These trips provided invaluable insight into university life, inspiring our students to aim high and explore their future academic possibilities.



Finally, our talented performers from Years 9-11 took to the stage for a superb drama production of Chaos by Laura Lomas. The cast delivered outstanding performances, bringing this thought-provoking play to life with energy and passion. Audiences on both Wednesday and Thursday evenings recognised the determination of students shown over many months of rehearsals and the ambition of staff and students in performing this play on the Langley stage. A huge well done to all involved, including Ms Stanley, the Performing Arts Faculty and all the staff and students who supported behind the scenes to make the production such a success.

Mr Seward and I have had the privilege of leading assemblies this week to Years 7-10 and Year 13. Having joined the school in September, we reflected on what had attracted us to work at Langley Park School for Girls and how important to us it was to capture this and ensure we build on the school's traditions, values and positive culture.

Students will have noticed posters appearing around school promoting and publicising 'The Langley Way' and articulating the way in which students

live our school values every day. The Langley Way is the way we do things here, provides clarity and serves as a reminder to students and staff of the behaviours, beliefs and attitudes which underpin what makes our school community so special and ensures the enjoyment, safety and success of all students.

We also acknowledged the many acts of deliberate kindness we see around school, as well as those reported to us by members of the local community. A recent e-mail from a member of the public informed us of the exceptionally polite and respectful behaviour of our students on a local bus and how students had given up their seats to elderly members of our local community. This was a joy to read and be able to share and highlights how our actions are perceived by others and their impact on our collective reputation.

Mr Seward and I also expressed how one of the highlights of our day is gate duty in the morning. We have been impressed to see how increasingly it is students initiating a warm greeting and saying hello as they come into school, before we get a chance to! This is another example of an act of deliberate kindness, which goes such a long way to making everyone have a great day.



We look forward to meeting with students on a 1:1 basis on Wednesday for our Personal Development Day and have shared appointment times with students and families. Students are reminded to attend school in normal school uniform and to arrive 10-15 minutes before their appointment time since they will be completing a pre-meeting reflection. There will be no possibility of rescheduling appointments where students arrive late. Parents/carers are requested to inform the school of sickness absence in the normal way. Students not in school next Wednesday will be required to complete these appointments on an alternative date after school.

Next week, we will be publishing a series of related personal development activities, as part of our home learning offer on this day. Students will also be encouraged to engage with online resources as part of our Teen Tips Wellbeing Hub offer and students in Years 10-13 may additionally complete revision for the Y10 and Y12 Assessment Week or forthcoming summer examinations.
