Dear Families,

As I reflect on the many activities taking place in school this week, I am reminded of my brief attempt to participate in group skipping in the courtyard one lunchtime. I am not yet sure whether this was to the admiration or astonishment of students!

Ms Stavrou has led a series of engaging assemblies this week on languages and language learning, in preparation for our celebration of the European Day of Languages on Thursday 26 September. It has been wonderful to recognise the many community languages spoken by our students and families at home, to see students attempting simple greetings in new languages and reflecting on the playful side of learning a language and the many benefits of doing so.

Thank you to parents and carers of Year 7 students for joining us at our Welcome and Information Evening. This provided an opportunity to meet the tutor team and receive information on our curriculum, reading programme, behaviour systems and the somewhat legendary Year 7 residential to Kingswood next month. I am grateful to all who have attended our recent in-school events and appreciate your commitment to working in partnership with the school to ensure our children and young people thrive – this is at the heart of our school vision.

We all have a desire for our children to achieve, learn without disruption and to develop into responsible, respectful and caring young adults. There are inevitably sometimes instances where students make the wrong choices and may act without kindness or respect towards others. I believe we have a shared responsibility to hold students to account for the highest standards of conduct, to support them to 'correct' behaviours and to learn from their mistakes. Our school sanctions (or 'consequences'), a common feature in all schools, are designed with this in mind. My colleagues and I have greatly appreciated the support from families where we have communicated behaviour incidents in school. On the rare occasions where we do not receive support, our experience is that students are more likely to repeat the same behaviours and receive the same sanctions.

I must congratulate the school community on their exceptional conduct and co-operation during this week's fire drill, highlighting the importance of a calm and orderly evacuation from school buildings in the event of an emergency.

Recent trips and activities have included a Year 11 Drama Trip to see War Horse, a visit to Hastings by our Year 12 Art BTEC students and a Bell Boating DofE Silver Expedition for Years 11, 12 and 13. Last week our Year 10 students participated and competed in public speaking workshops in partnership with the Jack Petchey Foundation and Speakers Trust, talking about topics of real interest and real-life experiences. Our teachers have also engaged in the launch of our professional growth programme, identifying areas of pedagogy and professional practice to research and develop within our designated teaching and learning communities. This demonstrates our commitment to continuous professional development and providing the best possible learning experiences for our students.

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In this letter to families, I introduce members of our Senior Leadership Team and their areas of responsibility, as well as confirming the changes to the school day due to our forthcoming Open Evening, in support of our preparations.

## Open Evening - Changes to the School Day Thursday 3 October - dismissal at 1.25pm Friday 4 October - later start at 10.00am

#### The Importance of Routines in Our Classrooms

At Langley Park School for Girls, we believe that establishing effective routines in the classroom is key to creating a productive and positive learning environment. Research shows that routines can have a powerful impact on both student focus and overall learning outcomes. Here's a look at the research behind why routines matter and how they are shaping our students' experience at school.

Routines matter because they:

**Direct Learner Attention:** Routines help students focus their attention on what matters most in the classroom (Begeti, 2020; Fuster, 2008).

**Prepare the Brain for Learning:** Learning requires focus, and routines serve as an essential foundation for achieving this (Dehaene, 2021).

**Support Developing Minds:** The areas of the brain responsible for attention and self-regulation are still maturing, especially during adolescence (Blakemore, 2018). Routines provide the structure needed for students to practice and improve these skills.

**Empower Teachers:** Well-established routines allow teachers to teach more responsively, fostering better relationships with students (McCrea, 2020).

At LPGS, we use simple, clear, and consistent routines across our school to ensure students are focused and ready to learn. These routines are shared throughout the school, making them easier to follow and helping students transition smoothly between classes. Below are the three core routines we use in our classrooms:

## **Arrival and Entry**

When students arrive, they are greeted by their teacher at the door. This is an opportunity to check uniforms, engage in brief conversations, and ensure a calm entry into the classroom. Once inside, students follow their seating plan, remove coats, place bags under their desks, and begin the "Do Now" task in silence while the teacher takes the register. This routine allows for a smooth start to every lesson, minimising distractions and preparing students for focused learning.

#### 3, 2, 1 Ready to Learn

When it's time for the teacher to gather the class's attention, they will use a simple "3, 2, 1" countdown. By the end of this, students are expected to be "Ready to Learn," which includes:

- Sitting up and facing the front
- Listening attentively to the speaker
- Answering questions clearly and loudly so everyone can hear
- Having nothing in their hands
- Tracking, which means looking at the person or thing they need to be focused on (teacher, board, or peer)

This helps students quickly re-centre and direct their attention to the lesson, optimising their learning experience.

## Ready to Go

At the end of each lesson, the teacher will summarise the key learning points and celebrate individuals by awarding P points and 'student of the lesson'. Students will then be asked to pack away their materials, tidy their workspace, and stand behind their chairs. The teacher will dismiss them row by row, checking uniforms as they exit the classroom.

When students have clear, consistent routines, they can focus better and feel more secure in their learning environment. This structure reduces distractions, allows for smoother transitions, and helps everyone maximise their time and energy in the classroom. These routines are not only vital for academic success but also for fostering a sense of community and discipline in our school.

We encourage you to talk to your child about these routines and how they can benefit their learning both at school and beyond. By working together — teachers, parents, carers, and students—we can create the best environment for success.
