I would also like to congratulate Una O Y8 who placed 6th at the British Schools Gymnastic Association Schools Trampoline National Finals in Telford last weekend. Una competed against 37 competitors from all over the UK!

This week has also been a significant one academically, with Year 10 and Year 12 students undertaking assessments during assessment week. Whilst I know that tests can be challenging, we have been impressed by the maturity, focus and resilience demonstrated by our students. These assessments provide an opportunity for students and teachers to assess understanding and confidence with taught material. Their hard work will undoubtedly pay off as they continue their learning journey.

Our Year 13 Religious Studies students attended *The Word Candle Conference* at Bloomsbury Baptist Church — a fantastic revision workshop that provided them with valuable insights and discussions on key topics in philosophy and ethics. Engaging with expert speakers and fellow students from other schools, this experience will no doubt support their preparation for the upcoming exams.

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Meanwhile, our Year 11 GCSE Textiles students had the opportunity to explore the Leigh Bowery exhibition and the permanent collections at the Tate Modern. This trip gave students a unique insight into contemporary and historical textile design, sparking creativity and inspiration for their own work.

We were also delighted to welcome parents and carers to our Year 7 Parents' Evening this week. These evenings are an essential part of our partnership with families, providing an opportunity to reflect on students' progress. Thank you to all who attended and to our staff for their time and commitment.

On Wednesday, our Personal Development Day provided an invaluable opportunity for students to engage in 1:1 appointments with their tutors and other staff members. These discussions allowed them to set meaningful targets for the remainder of the year, in line with their aspirations and future goals. It was wonderful to see students reflecting on their achievements this year and to learn more about our students through these powerful conversations. I sincerely hope that we will have demonstrated our care and interest in students as learners and people. I particularly enjoyed asking students to tell me something about them that I did not know and discovering students' interests and passions in Formula 1, Irish dancing, kayaking, skateboarding, ice skating, ballet and music; as well as the menagerie of pets some of our students keep at home! It was reassuring to ask students who they consider to be trusted adults in school and for them to name a number of key staff members, with whom they have positive relationships. A trusted adult is someone whom they feel comfortable approaching if they need support or are worried about anything. I would like to personally thank parents/carers for your support of this day, as we have introduced this in the perceived interests of our young people.

I am delighted to announce that we will be the Joint Secondary Music Lead School for Bromley, alongside Hayes School, working with Bromley Youth Music Trust and other music services and lead schools in South East London. This is in recognition of the curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities we provide for children and young people in Music. We look forward to working in partnership with others to support the delivery of training and develop school music provision across the borough in new and exciting ways.

This evening our talented dance students will be showcasing their hard work and creativity in our Mixtape production at Langley Park Centre for the Performing Arts. This promises to be a fantastic evening of performance, and we are incredibly proud of all involved.

And finally, looking ahead to next week, our Under-16s football team will be playing in front of a home crowd for the Bromley Cup Semi Final against Newstead Wood School. This follows their incredible success in the Kent Cup, which saw them crowned champions earlier this term.


