Dear Families,

In this week's letter to families, among many other things, it is a real pleasure to share the success of individual students and our teams in sport while also reflecting on the strength of our school community.

On what was an extraordinarily wet and windy morning, it was a privilege to be on duty meeting and greeting students on entry to the school. We all recognise the importance of a positive start to the day, the impact of a smile, greeting or exchange. It is consistently a highlight for me, as I know it is for my colleagues, welcoming students with a 'good morning' or wishing them a good day. I was especially touched by the warmth of students' responses this morning (although this might also be because I was not on duty at the gate but welcoming our Sixth Form students into reception!) I hope that the students' mood was lifted as much as mine by the positive exchanges we shared, emphasising the importance of 'belonging' and the impact of 'kindness' on ourselves and others.

Earlier this week, Mr Seward and I met with a group of parents/carers to progress our plans to relaunch the Parent, Teacher and Friend Association (PTFA). We look forward to inviting you shortly to our Annual General Meeting in late February and to requesting nominations for roles on the committee.

Ahead of Holocaust Memorial Day on Monday 27 January, our KS3, KS4 and KS5 students participated in a webcast on Wednesday providing the rare opportunity to hear the testimonies of Hedi Argent or Mala Tribich, survivors of the Holocaust.

The theme for this year's Holocaust Memorial Day is 'For a better future' and provides an opportunity to learn both from and about the past, taking actions to make a better future for all. Whilst racism and hatred do not always lead to genocide, all genocides begin with insidious stages including propaganda, 'othering' and dehumanisation. We can and must speak up, speak out and challenge prejudice, believing in and committing to a future where people are not suffering prejudice, persecution or persecution because of their faith, ethnicity or other characteristic.

Building on the partnership working and strong collaboration between schools in our trust, a number of our Year 11 English students came together this week for an event at Langley Park School for Boys. Teachers from each of the schools shared valuable insights during a focussed seminar on GCSE English skills.

Personal Safety

I wanted to make families aware of a reported incident earlier this week where two young people were followed by people on mopeds in the area about Eden Park.

Students are reminded of the following safety advice:

- 1. Taking the most direct route home.
- 2. Sticking to a recognised route that parents/carers would be expecting them to take.
- 3. Retaining a charged phone where they have one.
- 4. Not taking short cuts through parks and fields, alleys etc, particularly during the darker evenings.
- 5. Should anyone cause them difficulty or there be someone who they are worried about take themselves to a busy area, contact a parent, carer, or other family member etc. Where required seek help from others think about who it might be best to approach ie. shop staff, a lady with children etc (this doesn't guarantee safety and students should be aware of this, but likely to be a better choice than approaching a lone male). If near to school, then return and seek assistance from a staff member.
- 6. Not to openly display expensive items the latest iPhone, Canada Goose jackets, cash, smart watches etc as these are the items that are most frequently targeted.
- 7. Not walking alone with headphones/air pods in and remaining alert regarding their surroundings.
- 8. Don't assume that other young people are safe and do not pose a threat. Most of the robberies we have been aware of in recent times have been committed by other young people.

Finally, please could I request your support in reminding students that they are not permitted to use mobile phones/mobile devices in school and these should not be seen or heard on the school site at any time during the school day, including before the start of school. Mobile phones should be switched off and in pockets, school bags or lockers. Earphones and headphones must also not be worn around school.

My Child At School (MCAS)
