Dear Families,

The colder weather this week, whilst more normal for this time of the year, has certainly come as a shock and has also served as a reminder to me to communicate our operating procedures in the event of extreme weather, as outlined later in this week's newsletter.

A real highlight for me has been seeing over 200 Year 7 students belting out Abba classics across two evenings at our Mamma Mia Concerts, which have become something of a tradition at Langley. Congratulations to all and especially those who put themselves forward to perform as soloists, rightly earning the praise and respect of an appreciative audience of family, friends and school staff, as well as their peers. All benefited from the opportunity and experience of performing, demonstrating our school values of belonging and determination, while also having fun and bringing joy to all who had the pleasure of attending. I am also certain that they will look back on this for many years to come!

Careers appointments/briefings are well underway for our Year 11 students with Mrs Hayden and Miss Day. These will support our students in making subject choices for Sixth Form study and selecting appropriate college courses, aligned to their future ambitions. Our preparations are also in hand for the forthcoming Sixth Form Open Evening on Thursday 4th December, when we look forward to sharing with our Year 11 students and families the richness of our curriculum offer and wider opportunities and experiences within LPGS6.

During tutorial sessions this week, students have been discussing the recent hurricane Melissa which struck Jamaica and other Caribbean nations, causing widespread destruction to property, flooding and loss of life. Our students also completed a session on road safety, reflecting on distractions, understanding the stopping distances of vehicles travelling at various speeds and what our students can do to be safer including:

- Considering their distractions before crossing roads
- Watching out for friends since awareness levels decrease when in a group
- Choosing well-lit streets and avoiding lonely or isolated areas

This ties in with road safety week and an important young driver awareness session attended by our Year 13 students on Monday, facilitated by external partners.

It has been a real pleasure to see us re-establishing our student council this term and to see the interest from our young people in representing the views of others and identifying and leading whole-school improvements. The results of our student elections are below and we look forward to hearing and acting on students' suggestions and supporting their work this year, with the first meetings due to take place next week.

MESSAGES FROM STAFF

Bromley Police Safety Tips

Earlier this week, I attended the *Educate to Prevent Youth Harm* workshop for school leaders. Below is some information which Bromley Police have asked us to share with students and parents/carers.

- Stay in populated areas within the town centre. Suspects target lone individuals around parks and isolated back roads.
- Keep valuables out of sight, especially mobile phones.
- Enable tracking on phones.
- Register your phone on the national mobile phone register.
- Record your IMEI in a safe place (dial *#06# to find it).
- Expensive clothing, especially coats, is targeted. Consider placing a tracker in pockets.
- Insure expensive items on your home insurance, as typical clothing often gets missed.
- Use a Zip card on buses so the exact bus can be identified for CCTV.

SEVERE WEATHER CONDITIONS

Here is a reminder of key information regarding school closure in the event of severe weather conditions.

- The decision to open or close the school will be made by the Headteacher
- The decision will be made by 7.00am
- The decision will be communicated on the school website and via e-mail.
 (You are advised to check this before sending your child to school)

If it has snowed, please do not assume that the school will be closed. The school will only close if it places the health and safety of staff and students at risk.

If weather conditions deteriorate whilst the school is in session, we will contact parents/carers to inform them of the situation via the website and e-mail. Students will be kept informed of the decision and guidance will be given as to the next steps.

We are committed to ensuring that all our students are able to maximise their potential and any decision to close the school will not be taken lightly. We will aim to remain open or partly open during inclement weather to avoid disruption to students' learning but will consider the conditions and safety of students on the school site, public transport as well as levels of staffing. Langley Park School for Girls has good public transport links and we rely on parents/carers to make appropriate decisions about student safety, appropriate clothing and footwear when travelling to school during such weather.

7 things we should say more often

As part of our values-based curriculum, we are encouraging students to demonstrate kindness in their everyday interactions with others.

Kindness isn't about grand gestures. It's in the small things we say and do every day. Words have power — they can heal, uplift, and connect us. We believe that there are **7 things we should say more often.**

"Thank you" - gratitude shows appreciation. It tells others that their efforts, no matter how small, are seen and valued. Saying 'thank you' is like giving someone a little gift. It costs nothing, but it means everything.

"Excuse me" shows appreciation for others' space and time. It's a small phrase than opens doors – literally and figuratively.

"I'm sorry" - apologising takes courage. It's not about being weak but about being strong enough to admit when we're wrong

" I forgive you" - forgiveness frees both the forgiver and the forgiven. It's a gift you give yourself as much as the other person.

"Please" turns a demand into a request. 'Please' is a magic word – not because it gets you what you want, but because it shows you care how you ask.

"I disagree with you but I still like you as a person" teaches respect for different opinions. We can disagree without being disagreeable. Kindness doesn't mean we always agree but it means we listen, respect and stay connected even when we don't.

"Saying something nice" - compliments and kind words can change someone's whole day, or even their life. If you think something nice about someone, say it. We never know how much they might need to hear it.

I hope in sharing this with you as parents/carers this might support your discussions and the work we do jointly as school and families in reinforcing our expectations of courteous and respectful communication.


