Dear Families,

I hope that students, staff and families enjoyed the Easter break.

I commend our Year 11 and 13 students who were engaged in revision over the last two weeks, both at home and in school with a significant number of students attending in-school revision sessions. This week, in our parent information sessions, we recognised the incredible support and encouragement that our students are receiving at home and expressed our appreciation for this – it is certainly clear that the exams season can be a source of additional stress for all involved!

Thank you to parents/carers of students in Years 11 and 13 who attended our parent information sessions this week, at which we shared important information about the exams and exams compliance.

In light of the exams season fast approaching, I will next week be confirming with students and families slight changes to our whole school lesson timings from Tuesday 6 May, which will minimise disruption to students sitting exams at this time. This does not affect the start and end time of the school day, which remain unchanged.

This week, we launched the 'Langley Lowdown', a weekly recorded briefing which serves to share news and important information with students during form time. In this week's edition we have informed students of the changes to our procedures for school lateness (communicated to families in this letter) and launched our 'Golden Week' taking place next week.

Following their success in the Kent Cup, our U16 Football team are competing in the Bromley Cup Final at Bromley FC on Thursday 1 May and we wish them every success in this game.

Finally, It was clear that I was one of a number of staff members that were excited today to welcome Geri Halliwell-Horner into our school! Geri is perhaps best known as an accomplished singer, widely recognised for her iconic place in British pop culture as "Ginger Spice", an original member of the record-breaking girl group The Spice Girls. Having written the Rosie Frost & The Falcon Queen and the Eugenia Lavender series for children and young people, she presented to our Year 7 and 8 students in the hall, answered questions and gave an insight into the characters, key lessons/messages and what it is like to be an author.

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MESSAGES FROM STAFF

Procedures for Student Lateness

At LPGS we are proud to acknowledge that the majority of our students arrive on time, ready to engage in their learning each day. However, we have observed a small number of students who are consistently arriving late, and in some cases, significantly so. This pattern is becoming more apparent, and it is essential that we address this issue in a structured and fair manner.

In order to ensure clarity and consistency, we are making adjustments to our current system for recording lateness and the associated consequences. These changes are designed to provide greater transparency and to ensure that all students, staff, and parents/carers are fully informed of the expectations moving forward.

Lateness to school, during Form Time (8:30-9:05am)

- All students enter through the main gate, opposite the primary school, which closes at 8:30am.
- Students should be in their form rooms by 8:30am. Arrival after this time is considered late.
- Once the gate is closed, students will enter through main reception and sign in at their Key Stage late desk.
- KS3 & 4 students will receive a stamp in their planner and KS5 students receive a card confirming they signed in late, this is to be shown to the form tutor on arrival to form.
- Students who arrive late to school, or form, after 8:30am will receive a same day lunch detention.
- Communication will be sent home to families for those students arriving late to school.

Lateness to school, after Form Time (after 9:05am)

• Students arriving to school after Form Time will receive a C2 next day detention.

If there are exceptional circumstances on the day, such as significant traffic incidents. This may result in sanctions being waived at the discretion of senior leaders. Students will be informed on entry.

Medical Appointments

We are mindful that medical appointments sometimes take place during school hours. Where possible, we encourage these appointments to be scheduled outside of school hours to minimise missed learning. However, we understand that this is not always possible. If a student arrives late due to a medical appointment, we will require evidence, such as an appointment card, text, or email. If no evidence is provided, a C2 detention will be issued.

Golden Week

As mentioned above, we are proud that the majority of our students arrive at school on time each day, ready to learn and engage positively with their lessons. To recognise and celebrate this, we are launching our first Golden Week, which will take place next week.



Golden Week is an opportunity for all students, from Year 7 to Year 13, to aim for an outstanding week of attendance, punctuality, and behaviour. Students who achieve 100% attendance, have no late marks, and receive no C points during the week will be entered into a prize draw within their year group.

Each year group will have multiple prizes available, including:

- 1 x £10 Amazon voucher
- 10 x 'skip the queue' passes (valid for one week next term)
- 10 x sweet treats from the canteen (kindly donated by Innovate)

In addition, all eligible students across all year groups will be entered into a separate draw for a £25 Amazon voucher.

Importantly, all students have the chance to participate, regardless of their previous attendance or behaviour record—next week offers a fresh opportunity to succeed.

There are a total of 148 prizes available across the school. Winners will be announced during the week commencing 5 May.

Studybugs

Whilst promoting positive attendance we want to take the opportunity to remind families of the app Studybugs, which can report student absence in a quick and easy way.

PE Kit Expectations

Please support us in maintaining high standards in PE by ensuring your child follows these expectations:

- Bags: PE kits should not be brought in handbags. Only appropriate sports or school bags, as shown, should be used.
- Shorts: All shorts must be of mid-thigh length. Nike Pro shorts and similar styles are not permitted. If a student's shorts are deemed inappropriate, they will be provided with alternative kit by their teacher.
- Socks: Plain white sports socks (short or long) must be worn.
- Uniform: No part of the school uniform should be worn during PE lessons.
- PE kit must be collected for lessons as follows:
 - Period 1 or 2: before tutor time
 - Period 3 or 4: at break
 - Period 5: at lunch

Injury:

If your child is injured, they must bring a parental or medical note (for long-term issues). However, we still expect students to bring their PE kit and change into it, so they can take on an alternative role during the lesson such as umpire, referee, or coach.

Sanctions for PE kit issues:

- C1 Incorrect PE kit
- C2 No PE kit
- C3 Repeated failure to bring kit (triggered by 3 x C2 logs within a term)
